	Join the advisory board	NAF advisory boards are groups of business partners working with the academy leadership to bring skills and knowledge to academy students through a set of work-based learning activities and industry relevant curriculum. Advisory board membership is the most comprehensive, ongoing way to contribute to academy staff and students. Typically, members serve for a minimum of one school year term and meet monthly.
